I hope this message finds you in good health and high spirits. I'm delighted to extend a warm invitation to all District 7 citizens for our Annual Gourd Celebrations around the 4th of July. This Kiowa Gourd Clan will have the annual ceremony on July 2, 3, and 4th at the Kiowa Tribal Dance Ground in Carnegie, OK. The Kiowa Tia-piah Society of Carnegie will celebrate July 2, 3, and 4th at the Apache Tribal Dance Grounds located on the Native American Veterans Road, west of Fort Cobb. The Tia-piah Society of Oklahoma will host its celebration on June 29th and 30th at Tia-piah Park in Lawton, OK.

The Kiowa Gourd Dance is more than just a celebration or typical powwow; it is a ceremonial dance that expresses our spirit and identity. Participating in the Gourd Dance embodies "Kiowaness," reflecting our people's deep-rooted traditions and

values. Historically, the Gourd Society served as our military police, upholding the warrior society's way of life, especially when we practiced the Sun Dance religion. My family and I are pleased to announce that we'll host a camp during the celebration at the Kiowa Tribal Dance Gournd in Carnegie. We invite all District 7 citizens to visit our camp, share in conversation, and grab something cool to drink. It will be a wonderful opportunity to reconnect with one another, honor our heritage, and foster a sense of community.

Whether you are new to the tradition or have been attending for years, your presence will enrich the celebration and strengthen our communal bonds. We look forward to seeing you there! Remember to hydrate!

Legislative Update



Latest Legislature News

Hello Kiowa Tribe Members,

First and foremost, I am grateful for your support in approving the annual budget. Your trust and confidence mean the world to us as we continue to work towards improving our community. Additionally, thank you for re-electing me as the Kiowa Tribe District 7 legislator. I am humbled and grateful for this opportunity to serve you. As we start a new term and fiscal year, we will be conducting some survey work and strategic planning. Many Kiowa Legislature and Executive Branch members attended the Sovereignty Symposium in OKC city this week, exchanging ideas and thoughts on strategically bolstering our tribal sovereignty against the ongoing threats.

This month, the Kiowa Legislature has diligently worked on several resolutions and laws to enhance our community's governance and welfare. Here is a brief overview:

1. Kiowa Gaming Commission Ordinance Act of 2024

On June 13, 2024, we met to discuss the new ordinance. This act aims to regulate and oversee gaming activities within our tribe, ensuring fairness and transparency.

2. Kiowa Tribe Executive Branch Four-Division Structure and Organizational Chart Act of 2024

This act, sponsored by Anita Johnson (District 5) and co-sponsored by Michael Primus (District 2), proposes a new organizational structure for our executive branch. We're currently awaiting a public hearing to proceed.

3. First Amendment to the Employee Benefit Provider

This amendment seeks to improve the benefits offered to our employees, ensuring they receive the support and resources they deserve.

4. Minimum Commission Standards Act

This act establishes minimum standards and guidelines for our commissions, promoting accountability and effectiveness in their operations.

5. Resolution Petitioning the Secretary of the Interior

We have petitioned the Secretary of the Interior to issue a Federal Charter of Incorporation for Kiowa Inc. This will provide a legal framework for our business activities and enhance our economic development efforts.

6. Audit Authorization, Acceptance, and Responsibility Act

Sponsored by the District 7 Legislator, this act outlines audit authorization and acceptance procedures, ensuring transparency and accountability in our financial operations.

New Resolutions

1. Authorizing Bank of Oklahoma Bank Accounts, Signers, Powers Granted and Limitations

This resolution authorizes the opening and management of bank accounts with the Bank of Oklahoma, specifying signers and their powers.

2. Authorizing Sovereign Bank Accounts, Signers

Similar to the previous resolution, this one authorizes the opening and managing bank accounts with Sovereign Bank.


These events are great opportunities to engage with our community and learn more about our rich heritage and ongoing initiatives.





Episode 5 available now on Spotify and Youtube



YouTube Channel


District 7 has a YouTube channel. We aim to record and upload our webinars and different events so everyone can stay involved


